

Azar's Indianapolis home, demanding he approve new rules banning shock therapy at a Massachusetts rehabilitation facility. An advocacy group for disabled people called ADAPT issued a news

release, saying it organized the demonstration to protest rules that have awaited HHS approval for more than two years that would ban shock therapy at the Judge Rotenberg Center in Canton, Massachusetts. Azar is a former executive for Indianapolis-based Eli Lilly & Co.

Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department spokesperson Michael Hewitt

said Azar was not home at the time of the protests but several protesters were taken into custody at the scene. Police say 26 people were arrested for trespassing.




